### FOREWORD

The inner urge to express oneself results in an art piece taking shape. Mediums of expression vary. Some paint, others carve, build and give expression in materials such as clay and metals. In olden days the painters delighted in representing religious themes. The Renaissance is the period which abounds in religious paintings. Representation of nature or improvement upon it was striven by a great number of artists. Realism was the keynote of traditional painting. With progress in all walks of life new art forms have developed. The modern trend with its stress on movements is to create an art piece leaving the response and justification to the beholder. Those indeed are great who receive acclaim by the greatest number of beholders. The painting is truly great which leaves an image in the memory of the beholder, long after the picture is lost to sight. Each painting is an entity in itself to rouse sensations and impart an aesthetic experience.

An artist as a craftsman needs tradition. A creative artist does not. The relationship of the Guru and Shishya does not exist in Contemporary Art. The creation has to be one's own without striving to bring up a copy. It thrives in the individuality of the artist himself.

A characteristic of the modern art to my mind is that one has to live with it open minded. It will itself call forth the response and the

beholder will have to make himself intimate with the pieces before him. Sculpture and painting of modern art may puzzle and baffle at first sight but understanding and appreciation ultimately takes hold of the audiences. Above all one has to live with modern works of art to recognise their livingness and distrust critics, teachers and writers.

Contemporary exhibitions in popular museums have proved to be the best media of presenting the efforts of the artists to the general public. The circulating exhibition organised under the Unesco and various other organisations are travelling all round the world and helping in mutual understanding of the creations of one community by the other.

The predominant activity of the Salar Jung Museum is dissemination of knowledge and learning by demonstration as has been defined in the provisions of the Salar Jung Museum Act 1961. The present exhibition on view of contemporary Art is the third in the series of such exhibitions organised under the auspices of the Salar Jung Museum Board. It is my ardent desire and wish that the public take opportunity to view the creations of the artists of Andhra Pradesh. It is also my hope that the artists may also find buyers for their paintings which will provide the necessary incentive for greater efforts to come.

- 1. K. Anjayya: Native of Secunderabad. Obtained diploma in painting, from Government College of Fine Arts and Architecture, Hyderabad. Studied for a short time at Shantiniketan.
- 2. S. Charan Singh Gil: Born at Hyderabad in 1934. For some time worked as staff Artist of the Prince of Berar. Participated in various All India Art Exhibitions. Held one man show at Hyderabad. (1964).
- 3. Miss Dasharath Kumari Mathur: Born in 1935. Obtained Advance Diploma in painting in 1957 from Government College of Fine Arts and Architecture, Hyderabad. Her paintings were exhibited at various exhibitions throughout the country. She won the Hyderabad Art Society's Gold Medal in 1959. Held individual shows at Hyderabad in 1963 and 1964.
- 4. D. Dorai Swami: Born at Secunderabad in 1926. He did not have any formal training in Art. Exhibiting regularly for several years. Held one man show at Hyderabad (1965).
- 5. D. Devaraj: Born in 1942. Obtained 3 years certificate in Commercial Art from Government College of Fine Arts and Architecture, Hyderabad. Participated in many exhibitions.

- 6. Smt. Farrukh Rifaquat: Born at Hyderabad in 1935. Obtained diploma in 1963 from the Government College of Fine Arts and Architecture, Hyderabad. Participated in All India Art Exhibition held in Hyderabad and elsewhere and won several prizes. Held two individual shows in 1958 and 1963.
- 7. P. Gourishankar: Born in 1936. Obtained diploma in painting in 1962 from the Government College of Fine Arts and Architecture. Hyderabad and from J. J. School of Arts, Bombay in 1961. Participated and won prizes in All India Art Exhibitions. Won Gold Medal of the Hyderabad Art Society, 1964. Held one man show at Hyderabad, in 1964.
- 8. Y. Hanuman Suri: Born in 1929. Obtained diploma in 1961. Held one man show in 1963. Participated in the All India Art Exhibitions organised by the Hyderabad Art Society and also participated in Andhra Pradesh Artists's Exhibition in 1963.
- 9. Jayanth: Born in 1939 at Hyderabad, obtained Diploma in Painting from J. J. School of Arts, Bombay in 1964. Exhibited his works in Bombay and Hyderabad. Received Andhra Pradesh State Lalit Kala Academy's Scholarship and Studying "Mural Decoration."
- 10. Mrs. Kamala Mittal: Born in 1926 obtained Diploma in Fine Arts at Shantiniketan in 1951. Specialised in murals and handicrafts and received an All India Award. Represented in Indian Art Exhibition in Europe.
- 11. V. Madhusudhan Rao: Born in 1921, obtained diploma in painting in 1945 from the Central School of Arts and Crafts (now Col-

lege of Fine Arts and Architecture) Hydearabad. Now a teacher at the same college. Exhibited all over India.

- 12. M. A. Karim: Born in Hyderabad in 1936. He did not have any formal training in any Art Institution. Developed taste in painting while working in the Hyderabad Art Society. Awarded a prize by the Andhra Pradesh Lalit Kala Akademi in its annual state exhibition in 1964. Held one man show in 1964.
- 13. S. P. Pratole: Born at Hyderabad in 1940. Obtained advance diploma from Government College of Fine Arts and Architecture, Hyderabad. Represented in Lalit Kala Akademi of Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad Art Society and various private collection in India and abroad. His one man show at Hyderabad was organised by the Hyderabad Art Society, in 1965 at Ajanta Pavillion.
- 14. P. T. Reddy: Born at Karimnagar in 1915 obtained diploma in painting at Sir J. J. School of Arts Bombay in 1940. Awarded a scholarship in 1941. Held 3 one man shows in Bombay between 1942-1945. Held several one-man shows at Hyderabad, Bombay and Delhi. Participated in various exhibitions in India and abroad won several prizes.
- 15. Srihari Bholekar: Obtained diploma in painting from Sir J. J. School of Arts Bombay in 1961. Participated in many exhibitions in and outside the State and has many prizes to his credit. Held one man shows in Hyderabad.

- 20. Sayeed Bin Mohd: Born in Mahboobnagar. Obtained Diploma in painting with honours at the Government College of Fine Arts and Architetecture, Hyderabad. Exhibited in India, Cairo Afghanistan and Russia.
